The Principals, teachers and students of our sister institutions, parents were the special invitees. The Cultural Programme started sharp at 10.30 a.m. and it was a mix of monologues from Shakespearean plays, music, dance and drama.



Dance 'Asto Maa Sadgamay' by our students depicted the 'Shanti Mantra'. It was a type of contemporary social improvised dance style to create an aesthetic sense. The School Orchestra was a blend of light music of flute with western beats. The trial scene of 'The Merchant of Venice' enacted on the stage by the students had Shylock's evil design as its central point which was nullified by Portia with her wit and insight of the case. The Hindi Skit 'Azadi ka Amrit Mahatsav' was a kind of comparative study between the period before the independence of the country and the present day India.
